Communication, language & literacy



In phonics, the children are continuing to grow in confidence as they use their 'bossy phonics fingers' to sound out and blend simple CVC words using the phonemes they have learnt. They are also becoming more confident at segmenting three-letter words, identifying the sounds in order, and writing them down to form complete words. The children will continue to take home their Supersonic Phonics learning leaflets. These help to reinforce the phonemes we have learnt as well as sharing the next set of phonemes and a range of activities to support their learning at home. Please take some time to go through the leaflet with your child. Your continued support makes a big difference.

The children have now learnt three rhymes as part of their Rhyme Time! This term our new rhyme is called 'Build a House with Fives Bricks'. Mathematical development



Children continue to develop the skill of perceptual subitising. This form of subitising refers to instantly recognising the number of objects or items in a group without needing to count them. Children are encouraged to subitise groups of 4 and 5 items. This will allow them to develop an understanding of what each number looks like, and what it is made up of.

Children will count and subitise as a way of checking their representations. The children will represent up to 5 objects on a five frame. They will begin to understand that if the frame has 1 empty space there are 4 objects. If the frame is full there are 5 objects – they don't need to count!

The children will be exploring the composition of 4 and 5. They will be introduced to the idea that all numbers are made up of smaller numbers and that these are referred to as *parts*. Learning to see a whole number and its parts at the same time is a key development in children's number sense. The children will have practical opportunities to explore a range of ways to partition a whole number into 2 parts. A key stem sentence we use for this is for example, *3 is a part, 2 is a part, the whole is 5, there are 5 altogether*. The children will then build on this learning exploring ways to partition numbers into 2 parts, in a range of contexts. The children will be encouraged to find different ways to partition the same number representing the parts they see using concrete manipulatives or through mark making.
